



COVID-19 Deaths per Capita




COVID-19 Economic Recovery

Oct. 2019-Sept. 2020 Sales Tax Collections







REGIONAL Healthcare Center

Northside Hospital Cherokee

- Over 3,000 employees, over 1,000 medical staff, 35-plus specialties
- \$100M in expansion including medical/surgical floors, Cardiology and Surgery, additional 22 beds in ER, additional 80 beds with vertical, patient floor expansion. Currently, the hospital has 211 licensed beds.

Cherokee County has a strong presence from WellStar Health System, Piedmont Health System, Kaiser Permanente, and Children's Healthcare of Atlanta.

CHEROKEE'S Facilities

Cherokee County Jail Expansion Project

- Estimated completion date March 2021
- Will provide 582 additional beds and 109,000 square feet

Justice Center Expansion Project

- Phase 1 550-space parking deck, new security pavilion, records storage & a covered breezeway. Completion expected in summer 2022.
- Phase 2 100,000 to 185,000 sq. ft. of new space, renovations to existing building. Construction expected to begin in 2024.

Cherokee Regional Airport

- Widening runway to 100' & Lengthening to 5500' in 2021
- Later to 6000'



CHEROKEE'S Recreation & Parks

Expansion Projects

- E.W. & Edith Cochran Park: 90-plus acres in Free Home to include additional county services
- L.B. Ahrens Recreation Center: Nearing the end of the design process. Construction bid process expected first quarter of 2021.
- **SW Cherokee Parks & Trails Project:** Great public participation involving four parcels in the Hwy. 92 corridor.
